OUR RIVERBANK IS ONE OF THE BEST!

So says Nick Balfour from the Royal Botanic Garden who has been surveying pollinators and plants at 30 sites in Central Edinburgh over the summer.

The sites include the Botanic Gardens, allotments, cemeteries, rooftop gardens and many public gardens such as Princes Street and St Andrews Square.

There are two on the Water of Leith including Glenogle Court. The bramble and buddleia here attract many butterflies, bees and hoverflies and Nick tells us it is probably one of the best sites he has surveyed.

Pollinators are, of course, vital to sustaining biodiversity and the production of many of the tasty foods and drinks we enjoy. However there are ongoing concerns regarding the long term decline of wild pollinators and biodiversity more generally.

Surprisingly, cities can play a huge part in supporting pollinator populations, acting as potential refuges and offering diverse floral resources when they are well managed.

Nick is a Pollinator Ecologist at RBGE and his project is an offshoot of work in London sponsored by the charity Pollinating London Together.


BLACKROCK

Who are they and what is happening across the road?

A member of our Committee, Carol Notman, met with Gillian Duthie from Blackrock to voice some of our concerns following the opening of the offices across the road. They agreed to look at security and lighting but so far to little effect. Not sure that as neighbours we are that important to them.
